Non accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reasons.

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations:

- Some images do not have a text alternative, so people using a screen reader cannot access the information. This fails WCAG (Web Content Accessibility Guidelines) 2.1 success criterion 1.1.1 (non-text content).
- Some content fails to meet the contrast requirements listed by the accessibility guidelines. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.3 (Contrast Minimum) and 1.4.6 (Contrast Enhanced).
- Some content is not OCR'd and made accessible. This fails WCAG 2.1 success criterion 1.4.5 (Images of Text) and 1.4.9 (Images of Text (No Exception)).
