Accessibility Statement for E:Vision

E:Vision is the web based section of the SiTs database, which is run by the University of Huddersfield and supplied by Tribal. We want as many people as possible to be able to use E:Vision as possible with most of E:vision being compliant to WCAG 2.0 standards.

For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of E:vision using just a keyboard
- navigate most of E:vision using speech recognition software
- listen to most of E:vision using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

<u>AbilityNet</u> has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability.

An annual upgrade is also carried out that provides major improvements to the SiTs database. In both cases these updates may provide improvements to the accessibility of E:vision.

The University of Huddersfield has a continuing process of review and development of the E:vision section of SiTs. These developments look to address improvements to the accessibility of E:vision as part of wider developments to SiTs.
