Known Limitations

The included Video Editing tools may have limitations for users with no vision, as it may not be possible to navigate the video content with sufficient accuracy to achieve desired end results.

The included Subtitle editor may have limitations for users with no hearing, as sufficient information (e.g., from lip reading or signing content) may not be available on a related video stream.

Planet eStream does however offer authorised users' access to automated audio transcription services within the standard web interface, providing an alternative to direct creation of subtitles. Subtitles produced by transcription services can subsequently be edited using the eStream Subtitle Editor.

Users may also be able to further address some aspects of the above limitations by use of specialist third party tools in conjunction with Planet eStream, as media content

and associated items including subtitles can be exported from and imported to the Planet eStream environment by authorised users.

Included video creation tools may have limitations for users with no vision in directly verifying suitability and quality of the actual video content being captured by the application.

Included video creation tools may have limitations for users with no hearing in directly verifying suitability and quality of the actual audio content being captured by the application.
