Known Limitations

Contrast ratio for some of the text/controls may not meet 4.5:1 requirement. For e.g. Done button in sign up page.

Some of the area of the app may not adapt the large text settings. For e.g. Tab items and header sections.

Horizontal scrolling is observed, and the text contents are not visible after changing the browser zoom level at 400%.

Text elements may get truncated or overlapped after applying text spacing on the page.

Visual label for some of the UI elements is not the same defined semantically which differs than visual available label.

Some of the messages which appear may not be read by VoiceOver such as VoiceOver doesn't read 'Preparing for Offline use' message that appears on selecting the 'Make offline' button.
